

Pastor's page

In over 14,100 days of knowing each other, nearly 13,000 days of married life and some 30+ years of working in ministry together, there is something that Vikki and I cannot do at the same time, that is be in the kitchen and cook together. It just does not work.

I am blessed being married to an amazing cook, and a couple of times a week I also cook the main meal. This is something I enjoy, and yes, it is edible. However, we learnt early in our relationship that in all things culinary, we are incompatible. Whether I am cooking a full roast (yes, I can) or something simpler, I can only do so if Vikki is out of the kitchen.

Why? Well, that is where we get to the core issue. We do it differently. For some people it is the loading of the dishwasher that causes the problem, for others it is what mug to use (or not) for us it is simply we are totally different in our cooking methods. Vikki is incredible, she will start cooking and continue to prepare the vegetables and other things as she goes along. Me, I must get everything out on the side, then prepare everything and only then, when it is all ready can I start to cook. The result is that Vikki cooks a meal far more efficiently and guickly than I do, but when I cook, she gets a longer rest (and is really hungry) before the food arrives. As I said, we learnt this early in our relationship and we are totally chilled with it. But this is one way in which we are very different. Different is not a bad thing, we deeply appreciate one another's style, and the outcome from both is good!

I can imagine now, the readers will be in either Vikki's camp or my camp... but the point is that we are all different, we all have different ways of doing the same things, and different is not wrong, it is simply, well........ what is the word I am struggling for? Oh yes, "different".

In church we are blessed to have people who are so different from one another, and our difference is shown by the way we do things, we worship differently, pray differently, talk differently, and eat different food and wear different clothes. Some like to sit upstairs and others like the downstairs. Some like to sit at the back, others in the middle, and some even like the front row. In so many other ways our diversity is shown.

In Galatians 3:28 it says 'There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus'.

So, our challenge is not to question or criticise people who are different from us and behave differently. It is not to try and get people to be like us and do it our way. No, I sense that part of our life in 2024 is to celebrate our diversity, not tolerate, or question, but to truly celebrate and allow all to follow Jesus in their own style, while remaining covenanted together as brothers and sisters in Christ. In doing so we will discover a richness of blessing as we benefit from the fruits of one another's uniqueness.

Anyway, I must go, I am cooking tonight, and Vikki wants to eat in the next 2 hours!!

By committing to giving a gift on your birthday, of any amount, you will be 'choosing to bless others'. (Birthday Scheme New Bulletin 2024)


