A huge, potentially frightening change in their lives - Jesus was leaving them... but look again at the beginning of the verse, Jesus promises them that He is not leaving them alone, they will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon them.


Foglights Sunday School








Obituary - In His Presence with Thanksgiving

Leslie Emberson





I am sad to report the death of one of our members Leslie (Les) Emberson who went to be with his Lord on 22nd March 2018.

Les was born in Ilford and was the youngest of three children. He had an early passion for sport, football and cricket, which he excelled at, to become captain of the team. However, life took a difficult turn as he was treated in his teenage years for Ankylosing spondylitis and tuberculosis, and the long process of treatment left him with a fixed back and hips. His determination and stubbornness got him through after being told he would not walk again, and he overcame his disability, although his sporting passion had to move to watching rather than participating.

Les grew up in the Brethren church at South Park Chapel, where he attended from a baby until he was about thirty years old. He met Kath through the church and her correspondence with him while he was recovering in hospital and they were married in 1957. They later moved to Upney Baptist church, where there were more activities for families. They remained at the church for more than thirty years, during which time Les served the Lord in

the church as an "action man" or "DIY man" who would solve almost all practical issues, such as a kitchen extension, heating, decorating and much more.

Les was always willing to be there to use his skills and experience to help others, and this was his second job, after returning from his day job. Les lived out his faith in practical ways. He was a man of many talents who could turn his hand to most tasks and was skilled in carpentry, plumbing, electrics and had a wide range of tools and equipment, and often helped friends by utilising his skills. He had also installed central heating in several church buildings over the years.

Les was a good husband and father to a son and a daughter and a grandfather to three granddaughters, and a

real family man.

Les also had many hobbies and interests, including being a knowledgeable gardener and pond builder. His working life as a photographer was to work with many companies, including that of a "government official", and he also used his skills in wedding photography as a side-line for friends and he was also an avid stamp collector. These interests demonstrated his skills and knowledge which, together with his easy manner, meant that he was a dear friend to a number of people, and he enriched the lives of those he came into contact with

Les and Kath came to RBC around the time they celebrated their Golden Wedding and they celebrated their Diamond Wedding in 2017. Les's health was less good at this stage, but his character still shone through during the last year or so of his life.

The service of thanksgiving was a wonderful tribute to him and his character and a number of friendships lasting many decades, as evidenced by the presence of friends who had travelled from places such as Bath and Newton Abbott to attend. He was a man whose determination, stubbornness and a mischievous streak helped him through his own health limitations as well as family tragedies.

Les will be missed by his family and many friends, and will be remembered by many at RBC as a kind gentleman with a lovely sense of humour and friendly manner, whom it was a privilege to have known.
