



There is probably not anything else in recent history that has affected the whole world in the way that this invisible virus has done. As the world came to a moment of pause, with people being forced to stay at home, we have been forced to be still.

And the Psalmist says, "Be still and know that I am God."

We pray that everyone in the group will keep safe and be protected during this difficult time.










Pause to Smile

We are also feeling the effects of the Corona virus pandemic here in The Republic of Moldova. For the last 5/6 weeks we have been working from home and trying to figure out what our new 'normal' is. We unfortunately had to cancel our Missions Discipleship Training program back in March due to the widening reach of this pandemic. Being only 6/7 weeks through the 5-month program we were really downhearted and troubled as we could see such a large potential in the participants that God has sent to us this year. However, God is faithful! Even though our 15 participants didn't get to complete the program, we were still privileged to see how The Father was working in each and every life present. New Directions

We have seen an increasing need for basic necessities here in Moldova as many are unable to work and struggle even more than normal to afford simple things like food and drink. Through a sponsor, we have been able to start a project throughout Moldova which is being called COVID-19. This project is aimed at meeting this great need that many people around Moldova are feeling right now. Food packets weighing 30KG each are being supplied to churches all around the country to be able to provide for those in their local communities who are in need. Andy was able to go together with a couple of others from OM to deliver 300 packets to 5 different churches in the south-
