HAVERING STREETPASTORS UPDATE



Like many of us, there was no reauirement for work for either the Streetpastors or the Railpastors during the Lockdown period. Some of our volunteers took the opportunity to their help in church, where

there was a need for deliveries, or help those self-isolating, whilst others had to shield at home.

The Rail Pastors started back at Romford in June at the request of the Station management, who were concerned about general mental health and the effect this would have on the level of suicides at Romford. Our teams are now patrolling twice a week at different times after carrying out the necessary risk assessments. Our teams do not just observe for suicide watch but are also there to ensure the safety of travellers, so we ordered a batch of masks to hand out as the Railpastors interact with people. If you see them, say Hello, they are wearing a light blue Railpastor uniform!

The Streetpastors started patrolling in July but by August the patrols in Romford Town Centre became more difficult as the scenes on the street were chaotic. The Police are working with the pubs and clubs in Romford to ensure that the young people are correctly checked in to the venues, and currently the night-times are quieter than previously. Please pray for the Pastors, that they are able to keep safe as they work in His Service, both at Romford, Hornchurch and Romford Station. Prav also we will be able to complete a contract with Greater Anglia to visit further stations along the railway line.

Prayer Walk

Below is the suggested route to follow and possible things to pray for along the way. We were encouraged to also pray for what God was laying on our hearts or how we felt led.



Exit the church car park by walking up the drive and turn right, stopping on Main Road opposite the police station

• Pray for all those who work in our emergency services

• Pray for those who speak up for the vulnerable, those who of-

ten have no voice, those who are trapped in trafficking or violent situations

• Pray for the Christians who work in all parts of our justice system

• Pray for those countries in our world where law and order is prejudiced or where human rights are not considered



Stop inside the gates at Raphael Park – you have walked past a children's nursery and a hotel

• Pray for all those in our education sector, from the youngest to the oldest, those who are students, teachers, support staff and all those who work alongside them

• Pray for our leisure sector – those

who work in hotels, catering establishments, travel industry, tourist attractions and entertainment businesses, all of whom have been so sadly affected by the pandemic

• Pray for those who have been made unemployed as a result of the pandemic



Walk up the main path away from the lake and turn right along the grass bank, stopping at the corner of the tennis courts

• Pray for the health of those who live in our nation, especially those who are seeking to encourage healthier lifestyles, exercise and how we live

• Pray for all those who work within the Health Service caring for the sick

• Pray for the scientists who are seeking to find a vaccine for Covid 19 and who are looking into a break-through in the treatment of it



Walk along the path by the tennis courts, turn left by the café and down the hill, turning left along the path through the trees, stopping before you reach the tarmac path at the end

• Pray for the world in which we live – what sounds can you

• Pray for our environment, the way we treat it, the choices we make, the way we care for it

Pray for those who are caring for our world



Walk along by the lake and exit through the gates, crossing the road into Lodge Farm Park. Stop next in the area of the play park, outdoor gym and train station

• Pray for families, those within the park, within our church, our own families, those who find family life

difficult

• Pray for all those who normally commute to work, as well as those who continue to work from home and the tensions and difficulties that may bring

• Pray for those who live in fear behind their front doors, maybe because of abuse, domestic violence, addiction and loneliness



Continue along the lower path and just opposite the bowling green building turn right and exit the park. Continue along the road, turning right onto Junction Road and then left onto Dolphin Approach before walking back to the church car park

• Pray for those who live in the flats and homes surrounding the church

• Pray for those who are not part of the church but who come into the building to give blood, access help from the foodbank, seek support and advice or who are lost and need to know the love of God

Thank you for being willing to join us in prayer for our town and the needs of our world.

Our week of prayer and fasting drew to a close on Sunday 20 September and we know from various conversations that God has been touching lives. Whether you joined us for the various services, you prayed overnight on Saturday, at the prayer meetings, for the themes outlined each day or on the prayer walk or in the response on the last Sunday, be assured that God has been speaking to us.

One of the prayer stations on the final Sunday afternoon had the opportunity to consecrate ourselves again to God and, as part of our response, we were invited to write our names on a leaf and add it to the cross, to remind ourselves and one another of the new work that God is doing in our lives and the hope that comes from Him.

As was said more than once during the week, the time of prayer and fasting may have come to an end but our journey with God continues day by day. May we know God's continued leading and guiding in the days ahead and let us thank Him for all that He has done, is doing and will continue to do going forward. Praise the Lord.
